

THE FLOOD RUN

The Flood Run is a biannual road ride which began in 1965 with several motorcyclists riding from Lakeland, MN to Winona, MN to help the town sandbag against the flood waters of the Mississippi. The trip has been celebrated more or less (with time out for the Vietnam War) annually since that time on the third Saturday in April. A second run was added in the early 2000s on the third Saturday of September as



the weather is often better. Both rides now support Gillette Children's Hospital Fund, helping kids and families with severe medical conditions.

The North Star Riders motorcycle club, an AMA Chartered and District 23 promotor, in conjunction with Polaris Foundation and Indian Motorcycles, has taken over the management of the events since 2018. The club has enhanced the experience

by augmenting the Gold Star ride, adding a sport bike route, and adding a southern check-in area along the route.

This spring's run had some weather challenges, but with sponsorships,



merchandise sales, and rider registrations, more than \$16,000 has been raised to date for Gillette Childrens. See the official website for kids and families that have been supported by the Flood Run as well as information regarding the September event. We hope to see you in September!

HOW CAN I START RACING?

A sk every racer how they got started in racing and each person will have a slightly different story. The common bond is that they love to ride motorcycles and they love the intense thrill from competition. If someone new to the sport went walking through the pits they would also see that it is largely a family sport, especially with the younger competitors. This person would also get a feel for the camaraderie; an atmosphere of brotherhood that goes hand in hand with this sport.

As far as equipment needs the following are considered the bare essentials:

- 1. Any model off road bike
- 2. Gear including: helmet, goggles, gloves, jersey, racing pants, and boots.

Most any motorcycle dealer/retailer can get you set up with #1 and #2.

As one can see there is a lot of room for personal identity and choice if one wants to compete and that is shown in the racers themselves. Also, one needs to know a place where to go to compete, and that's where District 23 ARMCA can help.

Throughout Minnesota one can compete on Sundays from April through October at tracks that are sanctioned by the AMA (American Motorcyclist Association). Points are given for year end awards through District 23 ARMCA. The racer needs to join the AMA and District 23 ARMCA. You can join at the track or online at ARMCA.org/join. Receipts will be given for each membership. Use these to enter future races until your cards arrive in the mail. There it is in a nutshell for you new prospective racers out there. What you will experience can only be described by going out and doing it, but it can be one of the most enjoyable things a person can do in their lifetime. The only thing I left out was of course the desire to do it, that you have to seek yourself!

BEGINNER AND LADIES RIDES

he Twin Cities Trail Riders TCTR is a non-competition dirt bike club whose mission involves having fun while riding, regardless of the skill level, with families and friends as well as bringing new people into the sport. To support these goals, TCTR began hosting an annual Beginner Ride in 2018. This year's event will be held on Saturday, June 17.

The purpose of this ride is to provide an area for beginner dirt bike riders to develop skills before riding on public trails. This is accomplished by providing Dirt Bike School training classes, a Motorcycle Safety Foundation curriculum, at a subsidized cost and by providing skills building opportunities. The opportunities include cones set in a grassy area along with instructional signs to help riders with skills building exercises, a grass track, a couple of short and wider trails, and a mini track.

Beginners can get this additional seat-time without the worry of more experienced riders wishing to pass or other vehicle traffic on the trails. Spring Creek Motocross Park has graciously allowed the ride to be at their facility since the first ride.

TCTR added a Ladies Ride in 2020 to help women become more comfortable with the entire trail riding experience. This ride is open to anyone, young or old, male or female, but focuses on the ladies.



The ride offers a weekend of fun including guided rides through the Huntersville State Forest, how-to sessions, and riding games. Past how-to sessions have included how motorcycle engines work, riding through sand or other tricky areas, using the Avenza Maps navigational tool, basic motorcycle maintenance, tire changing, etc. Riding games have included a slow ride, riding a plank (on the ground), and a cone weave.

Guided rides are for all skill levels and include a forest road ride and a fast-paced ride through singletrack trails. Huntersville State Forest boasts more than 70 miles of singletrack trails and several miles of forest roads. Primitive camping is included in the ride. This year's event will be July 22–23.

GOVERNMENT IN MOTION

Meet Your Government Relations Team



ARMCA/D23 has 4 people that work on legislative and state government related items for the membership. Tom and Karen Umphress are the elected Government Relations Officers on the Board. Our Lobbyists are Ray Bohn, and his associate, Tom Hackbarth.

Tom and Karen Umphress are founders of the Twin Cities Trail Riders dirt bike club here in Minnesota. In addition, Tom and Karen have many other current and past affiliations:

- Tom is a Board member of the American Motorcyclist Association, the Minnesota Recreational Trail Users Association, and the Coalition of Recreational Trail Users
- Tom is a past Board member of the National Off-Highway Vehicle Conservation Council
- Karen is a Board member of the Minnesota Recreational Trail Users Association and the Coalition of Recreational Trail Users

- Karen is the State Chapter Coordinator of the AMA for Minnesota.
- Karen is a past Board member of American Trails and a past staff member of the National Off-Highway Vehicle Conservation Council

Tom and Karen have been the Government Relations Officers since 1999. They work with our lobbyists to help create favorable laws for motorcycle riding in Minnesota. More importantly, the team helps defeat unfavorable bills that would be detrimental to both motorcycle riding and off-road riding in the State.

The couple also works with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. This involves several meetings a year including seasonal meetings with the Parks and Trails staff, meetings on special topics such as the Grant-In-Aid program, and special meetings such as meetings with upper-level management to work to move projects forward.

Can you change the course of politics?

We hear the question of "**Can I** actually make a difference?" in what happens at the legislature.

The answer to that question is "Yes, you can!"

SF1324 – The hearing of this bill was cancelled due to the number of people who reached out to their State Senators and House Representatives. This bill would have set riding opportunities in the state back almost 20 years.

Did you know that it only takes around 7 contacts to an elected official from constituents for them to wonder what has people riled up on non-hot button issues such as abortion or gun control. Many people complain, but not many contact their representatives. Form letters and petitions don't really work, all comments submitted this way end up counting as one comment unless you can customize your response, including the subject line.

To find out who represents you at the state capital you can visit leg.mn.gov/ and use the "Who Represents Me?" links for both bodies. Just reaching out and identifying yourself as a constituent and an off-highway motorcycle (OHM) rider, without having a specific issue to bring forward, can make a difference.



ADVENTURE AND DUAL SPORT RIDING BY: MIKE LARSON

A dventure riding is often associated with larger motorcycles sporting knobby tires and possibly luggage. Adventure riding means to venture into the unknown. Distance travel using secondary roads, gravel, forest roads, two track, some trail following GPS tracks laid down by many riders before you, often camping, covering large distances.

Minnesota has 3 great routes, Wisconsin has 2, South Dakota has 3, Iowa 2. There are several Backroad Discovery Routes "BDR" tracks available for 12 different states as well, some extremely challenging with mileage ranging from 600–1200 miles in length. Many secondary routes also exist in most states that are shorter in length.

This will change the way you look and

think about distance motorcycling.

Comparably, dual sport riding is usually done with a smaller bike resembling a pure dirt bike but being street legal, and while many dual sport bikes do ride Adventure Routes, a traditional dual sport event usually focuses on more difficult terrain including several enduro routes incorporating technical single trails more suited to off road competition bikes. These events are usually tied together with two track, gravel, some pavement, and usually less than 200 miles in length. These events are gaining in popularity. They offer a variety of challenges, but are completion rides and are largely non competitive.

The Norsemen Motorcycle Club puts on an awesome 2 day dual sport event every year in Danbury, WI



(October 7–8). It is "Big Bike Friendly" as well.

If you've ever thought about either of these disciplines, they complement each other well. Most important though.....*Ride*.



FLAT TRACK: JACKS OF SPADE YOUTH PROGRAM

he Jacks of Spade Youth Program was founded in 2022 as a means of growing D23 ARMCA Flat Track racing. The Youth Program is comprised of the Youth Race Team, the New Kids on the Block program, and the annual To the MaXX race.



The youth on the Race Team are invited based on their attitudes off the track and the positive culture that they help to build towards newcomers at every D23 ARMCA event. In order to maintain their position on the team, each racer

must sign a contract, but the team contract has no obligations for competition. Instead, off-track behavior such as good grades, completing chores, making new friends, helping other racers, and assisting in the New Kids on the Block program are rewarded with a spot on the team. In 2023, the team consists of 5 racers (3 girls and 2 boys), an increased number from the 2022 team.

The New Kids on the Block program provides youth the opportunity to experience motorcycling in a Flat Track setting. This allows them to



spend a day at the track, learn how to ride and race, and make new friends, 100% free. This program includes a wide selection of top of the line safety equipment and race bikes for youth riders to use free of charge while racing and training. Jacks of Spade also has volunteer coaches at every event to help train new riders, and covers the fees associated with race day. This includes pit passes for the racer and up to two parents, AMA and D23 ARMCA day memberships, and up to 2 paid classes.



And finally, in 2022 with the founding of the Youth Program, Jacks of Spade became a 501c3 Non-Profit Organization and an AMA sanctioned race promoter. They rented out the Scott County Fairgrounds, built a track, recruited an entire crew of volunteers, and promoted their first race. To the MaXX racing was born, and is now continued annually (June 24–25). Jacks of Spade utilizes the funds from this event to support the other aspects of the Jacks of Spade Youth Program.

SPRING CREEK MX PARK

hat is Spring Creek MX Park? A Motocross Track located on Highway 60, 9 Miles east of Zumbro Falls MN. It is owned by John and Greta Martin and has been built up into one of the top MX tracks in the United States. It is one of twelve facilities to host a Professional Motocross race.



Who are the people behind SCMX? Owners John and Greta Martin are the two driving factors behind SCMX. John has the primary responsibility of building, maintaining, prepping the track, and overseeing the track crew on practice and race days. Greta's primary responsibilities lie in the behind-the-scenes organizational tasks including office work, bookkeeping, sponsorship contracts, overseeing the concession stand operations and the front gate. Danny Luloff and Roger Schellhammer, both ex racers help with track maintenance. John oversees the track crew which consists of many volunteers, Matt Schellhammer, Ryan Smith, Mike Janovski, Brent Bjugan, Adam Guberud, Joel Lenz, Joe Kidd, gate dropper big Tom Kidd, and Tim Walker among a few others. Mike Quinn Sr now spends most of each week helping John with a myriad of jobs, and has served as Race Referee for over 25 years. Mike Quinn Jr and Jennifer Martin run scoring and sign up with the help of Missy Janovski. Lisa Boaz, Kristine Rumpca, and Carey Quinn are the primary ladies behind recording the numbers as the racers cross the scoring line. Nancy Kidd and Cindy Rumpca are the primary gatekeepers at the entrance to the park. Denise Lindahl, Scott and Joyce Cripps. Eseguia Kidd makes sure our young racers on Track 2 have a quality race program.

Why is SCMX passionate about supporting motorcycling in Minnesota? Both John and Greta are passionate about riding, John himself is national class racer having won the 1985 National Hare Scrambles Championship. John and Greta have 2 sons Alex and Jeremy both of whom are Pro Motocross racers that have had success in the pro ranks with younger son Jeremy a 2-time outdoor National Champion in the 250cc



class. John grew up in a riding family, his love of off-road racing coming from his father. John raced both the National Enduro Series and National Hare Scrambles Series for many years. He was a factory racer for Can Am and ATK. Greta has been with him since his early days as a factory racer. Racing is in their blood. What are the long-term goals of SCMX? Long Term goals include supporting D23 and increasing district membership. Another goal is establishing a land buffer around the facility to ensure a solid future for mx racing in our area and state. As we as owners get older we are looking to the future as we want the legacy of SCP MX Park to continue for many decades to come. SCP has a rich history that dates back to Hillclimb events in the 1960's. Motocross at the facility started in 1971, we want to keep it going into the distant future.





ev there! I'm excited to use this column to pass along the knowledge and wisdom I've learned while racing professionally for 15 years on a variety of topics related to dirt bikes. health and fitness. I would like to touch on the fundamentals of riding a motorcycle. Now even if you've been riding for years don't turn the page! This information can be applied to all ages and all skill levels. Throughout my career I would regularly remind myself of these techniques and practice them almost every time I rode my motorcycle.

The 7 Fundamentals: Proper riding technique is essential to safely riding a motorcycle and even more necessary if you want to go fast. It will allow you to attack the obstacles at your local track safely, effectively, and with increased confidence.

- Elbows up: Getting your elbows up will give you increased control of the bike at all times; allowing you to corner faster and help you in high-speed situations where you may be susceptible to "headshake". This also forces your body to be farther forward leading to more weight on the front tire, which in turn helps keep the front end from washing out.
- 2. Head centered over the bars: If you look at all the top pros, one thing you will notice is that no matter where they are on the track, their head is almost always directly over the handlebars. Keeping centered increases your control and stability of the motorcycle.
- Grip with the legs: Gripping with your legs, standing in rough areas of the track, and in kinked, rutted



corners will allow you to minimize the energy required of your upper body. Energy is a finite resource, so save it for the parts of the body that can utilize it most effectively, and give your upper body a break!

- 4. Unlock the hips-butt out: This is absolutely critical if you want to hit a set of whoops or attack a straightaway with speed.
- 5. Balls of your feet: Whether sitting or standing, you always want to be on the balls of your feet. This allows your body to be more responsive and ready for whatever comes your way. You simply won't be as ready to react if you are standing on your heels. This also will give you a few more inches of "free" suspension to help you absorb those rough areas of the track.
- Look ahead: Get in the habit of looking a good distance ahead, you want to be prepared for what's to come and if you're looking 30–50 feet ahead down a straightaway vs 10 feet, this extra distance can make a huge difference! This will also make finding alternate line choices easier.
- 7. Breathe and relax your grip: We all have the tendency to hold our

breath and grip extra tight when navigating a tricky section of the track. Actively telling yourself to breathe and relax your grip can be a massive help in delivering fresh oxygen to those muscles you're working so hard. Have someone put on the pit board "breathe", or write a message on your bar pad.
